
86% of Cumbe community members are women and64% are women of color

by Amaany Clarke Darian Parker became obsessed with African dance at 19 years old after witnessing a moving performance as a sophomore at UCLA. Instantly, he knew that this would be a life calling. "If you've never seen her dance, there's no way I can put it into words." he describes witnessing for the first time Nzingha Camara dance. "When people dance, I can always see an aura around them. When I saw her dance, I had never seen an aura that big. It looked like streaks of silver lightning were coming off of her body and filling up the entire room. Growing up as a kid in North Carolina.
